2 Essays - sent electronically as part of the online application  The essays are a critical component of the application. (MAT Admission Requirements: Number 5 Graduate Catalog)  An inadequate essay may result in denial of admission, request for an interview, or remediation.
3 Recommendation Forms - sent electronically as part of the online application after submitting the application. These must be from professional educators who have observed the applicant's teaching or from professors who can attest that the applicant is likely to be successful in graduate level academic work. At least one must be from a full time professor in your major. Please allow at least 2 weeks for their responses.
