As our guests the next two weeks, we trust you will respect all of the policies and values at the core of our community of honor. These include: All students and guests are responsible for complying with university regulations (a description of university regulations and policies pertaining to students is available online at cnu.edu/studentlife/pdf/studenthandbook.pdf) and Virginia laws regarding possession or consumption of alcohol. Any person under 21 years of age is underage in the Commonwealth of Virginia pertaining to the consumption of alcohol. Students and guests may be subject to disciplinary action for underage consumption, possession or transportation of alcoholic beverages.

Part of the Christopher Newport experience includes immersing yourself in our community of honor. Every student at Christopher Newport commits to upholding our honor code, which is as follows:

“On my honor, I will maintain the highest standards of honesty, integrity and personal responsibility. This means I will not lie, cheat or steal, and as a member of this academic community, I am committed to creating an environment of respect and mutual trust.”

In order to make the Institute as productive as possible, and for the safety of all those participating, we ask that you do the following:

- **Remain on campus at all times, except for official events sponsored by the Summer Humanities Institute**
- **Arrive at all events on time and participate in the activities scheduled throughout the Institute**
- **Be mindful of prospective students, current students, faculty and staff involved, e.g., maintain good communication with your host, respect residence hall rules and property, and notify student coordinators or counseling staff of any immediate or pressing concerns**
